Creation Museum Free on Christmas Eve Answers in Genesis shows appreciation to community

WHAT: The Creation Museum is once again opening its doors free to the public on Christmas Eve in what has become an annual tradition as a way for the ministry to express appreciation to the community, and as a gift modeling the free gift of salvation provided by Christ, whose birth we celebrate this week.

WHEN: Friday, Dec. 24, 2010
10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

WHERE: **The Creation Museum**

DETAILS: The free day on Christmas Eve is a shortened day, with the museum closing early at 3 p.m. so that staff may be with their families for the evening. For this reason, there will be no Christmas Town events that evening. But the museum is free, along with the special “Christmas Star” planetarium show (on a first-come basis).

The museum has continued to draw crowds three and a half years after opening, and has received increased attention lately due to the recent Ark Encounter announcement (of a full-scale, all-wood Ark to be built). This past Saturday evening, the museum saw a crowd of 4,086 visitors for Christmas Town, a record number of visitors for the museum, surpassing even opening day in May 2007. Christmas Town, which is free, has four more evening dates: December 27,28, 31, and January 1.
